Final Report on Legislative Accomplishments Evaluation

This assignment asks you to connect course concepts to what you have accomplished as a legislator in the simulation. Your report should include two parts—in Part 1, you will summarize your key contributions to the simulation. In Part 2, you will evaluate your legislative accomplishments.

- This assignment must be submitted as a Word or PDF document in Canvas by Tuesday, December 3 at 11:59 pm.

To earn credit for Part 1, you must do all of the following:

- List the name, number, and status of each bill that you introduced.
 - Example: H.R. 1, “Veterans Identification Card Act,” Reported by the Committee on Veterans’ Affairs.
- List the name, number, and status of each bill that you co-sponsored.
 - Example: H.R. 2, “Justice for Victims of Trafficking Act,” Passed by the Senate.
- List amendments offered to other members’ bills and their status.
 - Example: Amendment 1 to H.R. 3 (The Mo’ Money, No Problems Act) eliminated the federal minimum tipped wage. The amendment was adopted and H.R. 3 passed the chamber.
- List all legislative organizations you joined and indicate whether you had a leadership role.
 - Example: Democratic Party (Minority Leader)
 - Example: Committee on Rules (Member)
 - Example: Congressional Black Caucus (Caucus Leader)
- List the bill number and name for all committee reports that you authored.
- List the bill number and name for all debates for which you served as floor manager, and indicate whether you supported or opposed passage of the bill.
 - Example: H.R. 2, managed time in opposition to the bill.

In Part 2, you will objectively evaluate your legislative accomplishments. To earn credit, this section of your report must address the following questions:

- Were you an effective legislator?
- Why or why not?

Your answers to these questions should highlight specific activities from the simulation and consider their impact on your ability to pursue common legislator goals—reelection, influence on public policy, and/or power within the chamber.

Part 2 of the assignment must:

- Be a minimum of 625 words.
- Be written clearly (in paragraph form) with no more than 3 grammatical or spelling errors per 250 words.
